ARTICLE 4. It was moved and seconded and voted to see if the Town will raise and appropriate, transfer from available funds, or otherwise provide the sum of \$8,752,286 for the purpose of paying the Town's share of the Operating Budget of the Central Berkshire Regional School District for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2023; or to take any other action in relation thereto.

ARTICLE 5. It was moved, seconded and voted to see if the Town will raise and appropriate, transfer from available funds, or otherwise provide a sum of \$312,385 for the purpose of paying the Town's share of the Transportation Budget of the Central Berkshire Regional School District for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2023; or to take any other action in relation thereto.

PASSES

ARTICLE 6. It was moved, seconded and voted to see if the Town will raise and appropriate, transfer from available funds, or otherwise provide a sum of 1,269,442 for the purpose of paying the Town's share of the Capital Budget of the Central Berkshire Regional School District for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2023; or to take any other action in relation thereto.

PASSES

ARTICLE 7. It was moved, seconded and voted to see if the Town will raise and appropriate, transfer from available funds, or otherwise provide a sum of \$65,000 from free cash to Account 132, the Reserve Fund, for fiscal year beginning July 1, 2023; or to take any other action in relation thereto.

PASSES

ARTICLE 8. It was moved, seconded and voted to see if the Town will raise and appropriate, transfer from available funds, or otherwise provide a sum of \$200,000 into the Treasury for the purpose of reducing or offsetting the expected tax rate increase in the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2023; or to take any other action in relation thereto. This is intended to offset the expected grant for Dispatch services; if the usual grant were for some reason not to be given, the Town would cover the expenses, and this transfer would cease.

PASSES

ARTICLE 9. It was moved, seconded and voted to see if the Town will raise and appropriate, transfer from available funds, or otherwise provide a sum of \$450,000 to each of the following Stabilization Funds: \$100,000 to the General Stabilization Fund, \$200,000 to the Capital Stabilization Fund, and \$150,000 to the Sewer Stabilization Fund; or to take any other action in relation thereto.

PASSES

ARTICLE 10. It was moved, seconded and voted to see if the Town will raise and appropriate, transfer from available funds, or otherwise provide a sum of \$300,000 to the Other Post-Employment Benefits Liability Trust Fund to reduce the unfunded actuarial liability of health care and other post-employment benefits; or to take any other action in relation thereto.

PASSES

ARTICLE 11. It was moved, seconded to see if the Town will raise and appropriate, transfer from available funds, or otherwise provide a sum of \$450 from KP Law, dated May 27, 2022 that was received after June 30, 2022.

The motion was amended on the floor to now say- I move that the Town transfers the sum of \$702 from Free Cash for the purpose of paying the following invoices from Fiscal year 2022.

KP Law \$450 Dynamark Security \$252 (4/5 Vote required)

PASSES UNANIMOUSLY

ARTICLE 12. It was moved, seconded and voted To see if the Town will appropriate a sum of \$214,941 from available funds to be reimbursed by a grant from the Commonwealth of

Massachusetts in accordance with Chapter 90, Section 34 of the Massachusetts General Laws, and any other enabling statute, for the purposes of highway maintenance, repaving, and similar roadway expenditures; and further, to authorize the Select Board to enter into contracts or grant agreements with the Commonwealth of Massachusetts for such purposes as necessary; or to take any other action in relation thereto.

PASSES

ARTICLE 13. It was moved, seconded and voted to see if the Town will authorize borrowing for Fiscal Year 2024 capital expenses in the sum of \$415,802 including \$188,888 for a loader for the Department of Public Works; \$161,000 for repairs to the roof of the Town Garage; and \$65, 914 for a cruiser for the Police Department including all costs incidental or related thereto and including all borrowing costs associated therewith; and further, to authorize the Treasurer, with the approval of the Select Board, to borrow said sum under Chapter 44, Section 7 of the Massachusetts General Laws, or any other enabling authority, and that the Select Board is authorized to take any other action necessary to carry out this project; and further, that any premium received by the Town upon the sale of any bonds or notes approved by this vote, less any premium applied to the payment of the costs of issuance of such bonds or notes, may be applied to the payment of costs approved by this vote in accordance with Chapter 44, Section 20 of the Massachusetts General Laws, thereby reducing by a like amount the amount authorized to be borrowed to pay such costs; or to take any other action in relation thereto.

PASSES

ARTICLE 14. It was moved, seconded and voted to see if the Town will transfer from the Sewer Stabilization Fund a sum \$19,522 to pay the City of Pittsfield for the additional costs of sewage treatment in the 2022 fiscal year; or to take any other action in relation thereto.

PASSES

- ARTICLE 15. It was moved, seconded and voted to see if the Town will transfer from the Capital Stabilization Fund a sum of \$46,324 for the purpose of providing the following item for the Fiscal Year 2024 Capital Program, including all incidental and related costs; or to take any other action in relation thereto:
 - 1) an administrative car for the Police Department.

PASSES

- ARTICLE 16. It was moved, seconded and voted to see if the Town will raise and appropriate, transfer from available funds, or otherwise provide a sum of \$54,460 for the purpose of funding capital items for the Department of Public Works for the Fiscal Year 2024 Capital Program, as follows, including all incidental and related costs; or to take any other action in relation thereto:
 - 1) a pickup truck (\$44,460); and
 - 2) sidewalk repairs (\$10,000).

PASSES

- ARTICLE 17. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate, transfer from available funds, or otherwise provide a sum of \$11,250 for the purpose of funding capital items for the Forest Warden for the Fiscal Year 2024 Capital Program, as follows, including all incidental and related costs; or to take any other action in relation thereto:
 - 1) a flatbed or similar-type trailer.

- ARTICLE 18. It was moved, seconded and voted to see if the Town will raise and appropriate, transfer from available funds, or otherwise provide a sum \$3,000 for the purpose of capital items for the Emergency Management Department for the Fiscal Year 2024 Capital Program, as follows, including all incidental and related costs; or to take any other action in relation thereto.
 - 1) one automated external defibrillator (AED).

PASSES

ARTICLE 19. It was moved, seconded and voted to see if the Town will raise and appropriate, transfer from available funds, or otherwise provide a sum of \$15,000 for Fiscal Year 2024, for the purpose of funding municipal website development, including all incidental and related costs; or to take any other action in relation thereto.

PASSES

- ARTICLE 20. It was moved, seconded and voted to see if the Town will raise and appropriate, transfer from available funds, or otherwise provide a sum of \$67,500 for Fiscal Year 2024 for the purpose of funding the following programs aimed at reducing the Town's contributions to climate change, including all incidental and related costs; or to take any other action in relation thereto:
 - 1) Developing a "Roadmap" plan for Climate Leader status for the Town (\$60,000); and
 - 2) Planning and hosting a Climate Fair (\$7,500).

PASSES

ARTICLE 21. It was moved, seconded and voted to see if the Town will authorize the Select Board to enter into a contract for more than three years for the purpose of providing software, operations, management and maintenance support for electric-vehicle charging stations; or to take any other action in relation thereto.

PASSES

ARTICLE 22. It was moved, seconded and voted to see if the Town will raise and appropriate, transfer from available funds, or otherwise provide a sum of \$5000 for Fiscal Year 2024 for the purpose of funding relocation costs for residents of condemned houses; or to take any other action in relation thereto.

PASSES

ARTICLE 23. It was moved, seconded and voted that the Town authorize the Select Board to convey an easement for access, utilities and construction on a parcel of Town-owned land situated off Bridle Road, more particularly described in a deed recorded with the Berkshire Middle Registry of Deeds in Book 948, Page 685 to Warren Farms Solar LLC, or its nominee, for the benefit of leased property adjacent to the Town property, such conveyance to be for such consideration, which may be nominal consideration, and upon such others terms and conditions as the Select Board shall deem advisable.

Citizens' Energy is proposing to build a solar array in back of the Transfer Station, on the Warren landfill property, as they were approved to do in 2014. The ability to connect with the electric grid was not present then, as it is now. This easement would allow them to use the Town's already-constructed road, which Citizens' Energy would improve, to the benefit of the Town, so that the array could be constructed.

Proposed Amendment made by the Chair of the Select board –Add to the end of the motion as read the words: "and to execute any and all documents related thereto".

ARTICLE AND AMENDMENT PASS UNANIMOUSLY

ARTICLE 24. It was moved, seconded and voted to see if the Town will raise and appropriate, transfer from available funds, or otherwise provide a sum of \$25,000 for Fiscal Year 2024 for the purpose of conducting a space-needs study for the Town, including but not limited to recommendations for: 1) redesign or renovation of any existing Town facility or facilities; and 2) leasing, purchasing and/or building any new facility or facilities; or to take any other action in relation thereto.

PASSES

ARTICLE 25. To change the location for all Town election voting from the Dalton Community Recreation Association, 400 Main Street to the Dalton Senior Center, 40 Field Street Extension.

It was moved, and seconded to change the location for all Town election voting from the Dalton Community Recreation Association, 400 Main Street to the Dalton Senior Center, 40 Field Street Extension.

A motion was made and seconded to amend the motion to say, "all elections".

A motion was made to, "consider alternative locations through a review by Dalton Town Clerk and Public Safety Officials of Dalton, within 120 days and Town Clerk to deliver that review to the Select Board for consideration."
